AMIR ZAKI, EBERHARD HAVEKOST

Amir Zaki's research into the visual structure of contemporary suburban living takes an ominous turn in his latest photographs. His Schindler House selection is dominated by pix of houses cantilevered off hillsides. Shot from below, these abodes seem not only absurd, but thrilling and menacing. Zaki's aerial views of backyard pools and "portraits" of fireplaces create the same accidental but satisfying geometries with the camera eye; but the reality-funhouse drama resides, of course, in the houses. Pairing Zaki with Eberhard Havekost helps introduce us to this latest darling of the new German scene as another formalist with a message. It's the usual one about contemporary anomie both imposed and relieved by what's in our visual space — buildings, people's sunglassed faces, video games. 
