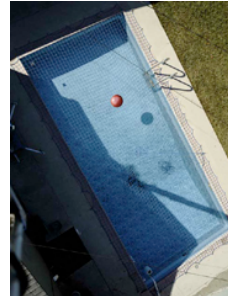

## Amir Zaki: Spring through Winter



Amir Zaki: Spring through Winter

**NEW YORK.**- Perry Rubenstein Gallery 23rd Street is pleased to present **amir Zaki** Winter. Based in Los Angeles, Zaki renders southern California suburban lands as fantastical and impossible architectonic structures through his photographic Winter presents his investigations into the entropy of architecture in a suite of around exteriors of homes designed by Richard Neutra that have been cantilevered angles, overhead shots of swimming pools, and interior fireplaces. While coming from the mundane and pedestrian, the work is subversive and disorienting, pushing realism. Zaki's work transforms architecture into relics of an ineffectual world: modernist California homes that have been refaced and restructured due to renovations, or redecoration; the artist's interventions become sculpturally dynamic and engaging.

This exhibition is Zaki's first solo exhibition in New York, although he has shown around the United States in Los Angeles, Seattle, and New York, and in the prestigious "Art Statements" section of Art Basel Miami Beach. In addition Winter is currently on view at the MAK Center in Los Angeles until February 21 photography at The University of California, Riverside.

"St. John the Evangelist"

London(ANSA)

Christie's in London confirmed yesterday that it will auction the painting "St. John the Evangelist" by Florentine painter Filippo Lippi, that according to "The Observer", was brought away from Italy after 1912. The renowned auction house does not consider the origin of the piece to be questionable.

"The current owner of the work, the American-French collector Barbara Pascale Johnson, acquired it eight years ago. It is a well-known painting among collectors, especially in Italy, and nobody has any doubt regarding its origin," said William Bra, representative of Christie's.

Yesterday "The Observer" posed different questions about the painting that, according to a letter, was owned by the Leonard Simpson, daughter of Maria Crespi, from Milan. "The Observer" mentioned that the piece, who takes out of the country in 1919 without authorization. "St. John the Evangelist" is valued at 2,300,000 dollars.
